Dear Representatives White, Arp, and Paré:

The Professional Certification Coalition (PCC)¹ writes to share our views regarding H.B. 819. As currently drafted, the bill would **unconstitutionally intrude on the First Amendment right of private organizations to establish and define their credentials**. The PCC's preference is always to work with bill sponsors on legislation where we identify areas of disagreement. We are a non-partisan organization solely focused on protecting and promoting the certification community through public policy, not advancing or opposing a political agenda. However, the constitutional implications of H.B. 819 compel the PCC to oppose the bill unless it is amended so as not to interfere with the eligibility and disciplinary decisions of private certification organizations.

Federal law already protects health care providers who refuse on religious or moral grounds to perform or assist in the performance of certain health care services, including abortion and assisted suicide.² The PCC supports the right of individual providers to refrain from participation in specific procedures that would violate the provider's religious beliefs or objections of conscience.

As currently drafted, however, H.B. 819 tramples the constitutional rights of private certification organizations. **By prohibiting enforcement of private certification codes of conduct, H.B. 819 violates its own principle that private organizations should not be required to act contrary to their "moral, or ethical beliefs or principle" or their "published ... moral, or ethical guidelines or directives, policies, or regulations."** As its core provision, the bill states: "It shall be unlawful for any person to discriminate against any medical practitioner ... that refuses to participate in ... a health care service on the basis of conscience." In Section 90-21.141(3)(g), the bill defines "discrimination" to include "**refusal of board certification**," and in Section 90-21.141(8), the definition of "participation in a health care service" includes "**referral**" and "**admittance** of any person or individual to provide any health care service."

As background, many certification bodies and professional societies for physicians, other medical practitioners, and allied health professionals have adopted codes of conduct that require that their certificants or members take no action that threatens the health and safety of their patients. Violation can result in loss of certification or membership.

Placing the health of the patient at the center of decision-making entails explaining relevant treatment options and risks to the patient and often requires referring a patient to another provider who is better able to provide treatment to that patient, due to their training, expertise, or willingness to perform certain procedures. For example, if a gynecologist were consulted by a patient with advanced uterine cancer, a hysterectomy would be among the

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treatment options that should be presented to the patient. If a particular gynecologist, for reasons of conscience, were unwilling or unable to perform a hysterectomy on a pregnant cancer patient, the gynecologist would need to refer the patient to another provider for consideration of the patient's full treatment options. Indeed, failure to do so could result not only in loss of certification for the gynecologist but also legal liability for malpractice.

Despite this, H.B. 819 would define it as unlawful discrimination (subject to treble damages) for a private certification organization to enforce its code of conduct in this circumstance. **For the PCC, this is a direct infringement on our members' First Amendment rights as private organizations.**

The Constitution bars the state from interfering with the free speech of private organizations, and choosing who to endorse or not to endorse through conferring a certification goes to the heart of private certification organizations' right to free expression. **The North Carolina legislature has no constitutional authority to dictate the eligibility or disciplinary codes of those private certification programs.**

Although H.B. 819 is limited in scope to health care-related professions, its overreach is similar to that of a Florida law³ that was recently blocked on First Amendment grounds by a federal court. In issuing a preliminary injunction against the statute in that case,⁴ the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Florida explained that "the First Amendment bars the state from burdening speech, while private actors may burden speech freely."

Challenges to the right of certification organizations to develop and define the content and requirements of their credentials have repeatedly failed. As the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit stated in *Kenney v. Am. Board of Internal Medicine*, a certification organization "has the right to control who it is certifying and what standards and requirements are necessary." H.B. 819 violates this fundamental principle.

If this bill is enacted, it will certainly face legal challenges, diverting taxpayer funds to litigation – and with the expected result that this provision of the bill will be blocked. **For all of these reasons, we respectfully request that you remove "refusal of board certification" as a form of discrimination and, consistent with widely accepted standards of ethical patient treatment practices, delete "referral," and "admittance" from the definition of participation in a health care service.**
