**Re: HB 575**

Dear Reps. Gullett, Hilton, Wiedower, and Williams:

The Professional Certification Coalition (PCC)<sup>1</sup> writes regarding HB 575. In its current form, HB 575 would incentivize individuals to challenge occupational licensing regulations, inviting administrative burden and expensive litigation. HB 575 could have an adverse effect on the health, safety, and welfare of Georgia citizens who trust the state to protect the public from low-quality or harmful services and could also compel the state to expend taxpayer dollars unnecessarily. **For these reasons, unless the bill is amended to remove Sections 43-1-8(a)(1) and (d), the PCC must oppose HB 575.**

The PCC supports a careful review of licensure laws to ensure that unnecessary obstacles to professions are removed. However, HB 575 invites a burdensome petition process and costly litigation against government agencies by directly creating a private right of action for individuals to seek injunctions against licensure regulations. The PCC opposes these provisions of the bill, for several reasons. *First*, the bill effectively shifts the burden of proof to the government in all cases, as any petitioner would be able to show that a regulation “burdens the entry into a profession or occupation.” By definition, all licensure laws do that.

*Second*, the government would bear the burden of proof in establishing that the challenged regulation is currently applicable and necessary, fulfills a legitimate objective, and is the least restrictive regulation available for the safety and well-being of the citizens of Georgia, according

to the hierarchy of least restrictive to most restrictive listed in the bill. This hierarchy has not previously been a touchstone of occupational regulation in Georgia, so no government agency will have data comparing the effects of regulation according to that hierarchy.

Moreover, inviting costly litigation that the state would have to defend would waste limited state resources and taxpayer dollars. The threat and likelihood of litigation, and the cost burden of the resulting legal expenses, would create significant budgetary pressures on the state to eliminate occupational licensure wherever feasible, even when doing so would not be in the best interest of Georgia citizens. With respect, the PCC suggests that the legislature and state agencies should instead take a leadership role in carefully considering whether any specific occupational licensure requirements may be unduly restrictive, rather than spurring litigation battles for judges to resolve.

The PCC stands ready to work with lawmakers who seek to craft legislation that strikes a reasonable balance between the benefits of occupational licensing and the desire for free markets in employment. Unfortunately, in its current form, this legislation goes too far in enabling removal of protections for the public.
